

1972 production saw a low of 1,893 Satellite Regent 6-Passenger Wagons and a high of 212,311 Duster Sport Coupes (not including Duster "340" models).

Gone Too Soon



2022 Raffle Car is Here

With the months slowly passing and spring approaching, the hunt for our raffle car intensified. Like the tale of Goldilocks, some cars seemed too small, too worn, too expensive, but none were just right. Both Paul Jr. and Mike Signorile then spotted a new listing for a 2005 Mustang convertible that warranted a closer look. Artie Guarnieri and Rocky Pompa joined Mike for a look see, and negotiated a deal to buy the car. It's Perfomance White with a black top and charcoal interior. It's a 4.0L V6 with 210 horsepower, wrapped in the all new body for 2005 that invoked the original Mustang's style. It rides on machined aluminum rims with chrome spinners. It needed a thorough cleaning and detailing, and a little TLC on the painted front bumper (still to be done).



A total 28,793 V6 convertibles were built that year. Breaking it down further, only 1,512 were painted white with a black top and an automatic transmission, and only 740 of those had charcoal interior. Tickets this year are simplified - each chance is \$5, and \$20 gets you five chances. We've purchased 3000 tickets, so the \$20 option this year is even better odds than \$20 got you last year.

Inside the SIRAACA Garage

We remain inside the SIRAACA Garage as we spot another newcomer within its confines. This is Joe D'Amore's recently acquired 1995 Cadillac DeVille.

Joe always wanted a muscle car, and perhaps someday he'll have one, but he's cutting his teeth on this Caddy, because it was too nice to pass up.

It's powered by Cadillac's 4.9-liter OHV V-8, mounted transversely to put power to the front wheels. It's painted Majestic Amethyst Metallic (say that three times fast) with shell-colored interior.

Cadillac offered an upmarket DeVille Concours as well which featured the Northstar engine and more horse-power (275 vs. 200). Interestingly enough, the Concours does not have a hood ornament like Joe's DeVille, and it's rear wheel opening is not cut out as high.

They used to say that when a Cadillac owner decides to leave Caddy, it's for one of three places: Heaven, Hell or a Lincoln dealer. We think Joe might have another place in mind, where muscle cars run free. Until then, he'll be riding in style in his grand sedan.
