2018 Durant Annual Meet & Tour

The Durant Motors Automobile Club represents the cars that made up Billy Durant's second empire, following his creation and ouster of GM. They include Durant, Star, Rugby, Flint, Frontenac, DeVaux, Dort, certain Locomobiles and Continental. SIRAACA member Ed Vomero, with his three 1923 Star Touring cars, informs us that plans are underway to bring their annual meet to Staten Island in 2018. It will coincide with our 42nd Annual Fall Show that September (date to be confirmed). Ed is also making plans for the Durant folks to tour Historic Richmond Town with their cars, and show them some real New York hospitality. Our club is excited to extend a welcome to the Durant Motors Automobile Club to our island and have them share their wonderful and unknown cars with us.

Auction Action

While we do not know if the new owner of Tucker #1049 will keep the car in Europe or is an American buyer bringing it home, we do know that it sold for 1.344 million Euros at RM Auction's sale in Monaco last month. That's \$1.52 million for those of you playing at home.

Closer to home, the Elegance at Hershey will add an auction to its schedule of events this year, to be held on June 11 under the banner of newcomer The Finest Automobile Auctions. In keeping with the Beetle-mania that this year's auction action has seen, they are teeing up one of the rarest of all Beetles. It's a 1943 KdF Type 60 Beetle. The KdF-Wagen was the first example of the car we know as the VW Bug. A small number were built between 1937 and 1944 and supplied to minor government officials. The one being sold was destined for the Red Cross Chief in Berlin in 1943. It was discovered and identified in Poland in 2000, and underwent a painstaking restoration by the leading expert on such cars in Frankfurt. The car has no brightwork and is completely finished in matte grey, including wheel covers, bumpers and headlight rings. The estimated selling price is \$275,000 to \$350,000. The AACA Annual Grand National Meet was held on the first weekend of June in Williamsport, PA and broke a AGNM record for the number of vehicles in attendance with 634 on the field. Grand National Meets are reserved for AACA Senior Award winners only, with tighter scoring criteria to determine winners. To be awarded a Grand National Award, a car must score a minimum of 380 out of 400 points AND be within 5 points of the highest scoring car in its class. 394 points won't cut it if there's a 400pointer in your midst.

Taking home that award was Ed Vomero with his 1923 Star touring car.

Kevin Keenan competed with his low-mileage, unrestored 1979 Buick LeSabre and was also awarded a First Grand National Award after proving that his all-original, factory hose clamps were indeed correct for his car.

Congratulations to both Ed and Kevin for coping with less than ideal weather conditions and a long drive to take awards among AACA's best of the best.
