

Here are a pair of advertising cards for two distinctly different Auburns from 1927. If formal sedans were your thing, you could opt for the 8-88 sedan seen in the top card. If sporty, open air roadsters were more in line with your view, the bottom card most likely caught your eye. Selling both power and comfort, the straight eight was good for 80 mph and would set you back over \$2,000.

We're a big fan of both cars, which sharing common styling cues. Our favorite was the way the two-tone paint didn't follow the belt line, but rather swooped up and to a point across the hood into the hood ornament.



The club's fortunes were as bright as the morning sun on September 16 as summer held on to deliver blue skies and warm temperatures as the backdrop for our 42nd annual car show. 400 or so vehicles covered the field for spectators to gawk at and judges to deliberate over, When the judging was over, the special award winners were asked to drive up to the red carpet to receive their trophies, handed out by Miss Staten Island, Nicole Doz. Honors went to Jimmy Cuadrado's 1991 Honda Accord for Best Engine, Joe Terranova's 1957 Olds Fiesta for Besr Interior, Steve Sacco's 1959 Cadillac Coupe de Ville for Best Chrome, Joseph Stasio's 1955 Chevrolet Bel Air for Best Paint (Stock), Pat Maggiore's 1934 Chevrolet for Best Paint (Custom), Albert Cirino's 1979 Peterbilt for Best Truck, Paul Mauceri's 1933 Ford for Best In Show (Custom), Al Yarusinki's 1968 Chevrolet Camaro for Best in Show (Modified), Charles Spitz's 1930 Durant Model 407 for Best in Show (Pre-War), Ted Mardikos' 1969 Plymouth GTX for Best in Show (Post War), and Angelo Boncoraglio's 1971 Buick Riviera GS for President's Cup..

The show featured visiting members of the Durant Motors Automobile Club, who were on Staten Island for their annual meeting. Along with the 1930 Durant mentioned above, they showed a 1923 Durant touring car and a 1931 DeVaux Model 6-75 sedan. They were joined by Ed Vomero's 1923 Star touring car.

"Big Daddy" George displayed his hand-built "Island Princess" (a hot rodded Cinderella's coach) and Grandpa Munster's Drag-u-la. Both drew plenty of onlookers and picture takers all day long.

The latest car to join the SIRAACA Garage is the 2019 raffle car! We purchased this 1992 Chevrolet Camaro RS coupe last month, and here's a first look for some of you..

The car was found a mere two doors down from Paul Arena's house. The owner had contacted Mike Signorile about selling the car, and Mike laughed when he learned it was one of Paul's neighbors. Paul made the 100 foot journey to see the car, and together with Mike, suggested the club buy it.

The 1992 Camaro is the 25th Anniversary model. The RS coupe was extremely popular, with nearly 61,000 cars produced. Find an RS convertible, and you have one of just 2,562 such cars. Z28/IROC-Z convertibles were even rarer, numbering just 1,254 cars.

Our car has less than 45,000 miles on it, and the interior is impeccable. It even features a period-correct Motorola car phone. Early indications are that we have a great car to give away next year, but the ticket selling can start this year.







